1.1 News, Changes and Major Issues in 2020

2020 has been an exceptionally challenging year due to the Covid pandemic, which asked all of us to adapt at short notice to new teaching conditions, to deal with new research situations, to conquer home office blues and to keep in touch with students and colleagues alike when face-to-face meetings were no longer possible. While the switch to online teaching came sudden during the spring term and required staff members to become experts in using online teaching tools over a weekend, the summer break allowed us to plan in advance for the autumn term. When a renewed mandatory switch to online teaching was issued again, we were ready.

Despite all of these difficult circumstances, the department has been as busy as ever in research and engaging in academic exchange. Virtual conferences and workshops took place and the number of guest speakers (virtual rather than present in Basel) was impressive in the fall. The many research meetings and high profile research output is proof of productive and innovative research that we engaged in. During staff meetings in the semesters and also in separate meetings over the summer, we exchanged ideas and input on online didactics, revamped the introductory linguistics module and generally stayed in touch individually and as teams.

manner, adapted continuously to new situations and were tolerant of the technical hick-ups that marked the beginning of the year and the restricted access to the library, learning spaces and classrooms. Prioritising the first semester students and the MA students in the fall for face-to-face teaching under pandemic guidelines (the Grosse Hörsaal was the only room that allowed us to teach up to 40 students) gave us a chance to at least meet them at the beginning of the semester and to allow them to get to know each other, our seminar and Basel. We hope that we will be able to continue strengthening these ties during 2021.

While we all struggled on our own, it was reassuring to know that we also pulled together as team to make it possible for our students to continue their studies, for our PhD students to pursue their degrees and for research in general to thrive. A big thank you therefore goes to the staff members of the English department for their much appreciated team work and fighting spirit during 2020 and to our students for bearing with us and to be eager to pursue their degrees no matter the circumstances. Let's keep this spirit up in 2021!



1.10 The Gay Beggars






