1 Events and Activities at the Department

1.1 News, Changes and Major Issues in 2021

2021 – year 2 of the Covid pandemic – still kept us on our toes and required flexibility, tolerance and patience from staff and students alike. Despite the continuing challenges, we completed two more semesters successfully. The spring term was entirely conducted in zoom, while only lecture courses and large seminars were conducted online during the fall term and we taught proseminars and seminars with smaller numbers of students face-to-face. For many of us, these courses with physical co-presence were particularly welcome after only meeting through a screen and some of our newer BA students finally got to know the charm of our old premises and their University in general for the first time.

As postponing conferences, guest speaker invitations and project meetings is not a viable option when teaching and research exchange should strive, we were as busy as always also in 2021. The department hosted two conferences. The linguistics conference with the theme *Pragmatics of Translation* went entirely online with 153 delegates from all over the world, while Ridvan Askin's *Rethinking the North American Long Poem* could be held face-to-face. During both semesters we also hosted workshops and invited inspiring colleagues to speak at our Department during our courses in order to provide an enriching learning experience for our students.

In 2021, five of our linguistics team members were able to secure exciting positions: Daria Dayter left us for a professorship at Tampere University in August, while Jakob Leimgruber accepted a professorship at the University of Regensburg and Daniela Landert at Heidelberg University (both starting in spring 2022). Aline Bieri left us for the ZHAW and Joelle Loew for the Fachhochschule Luzern. Andrea Wuest is now working fulltime at the University's Graduate Center. Laura Contessi, HiWi since February 2021, will leave for a different university to pursue her MA degree in January 2022. We thank all of them for their work and wish them much success at their new workplaces and institutions. We also had to say our final farewell to our former colleague Markus Marti, whose inspiring work on Shakespeare and his teaching at the seminar for many years had crucially contributed to our department life in the past; you can find an obituary in his honour online. New team members who joined us during the 2021 are Carolin Debray in linguistics, Thomas Manson in literature and cultural studies, Daniela Keller, who rejoined us after her maternity leave, and Kathrin Eckerth who replaced Andrea Wuest.

In November – just before meetings were no longer advisable due to rising infection numbers – the EnglSem staff was able to spend an evening together at the *Brauerei* restaurant for our customary (early) Christmas dinner. As such outings are no longer taken for granted, it was a particular treat to be able to sit together and enjoy each other's company. Knowing that the pandemic is not over yet, we are nevertheless well prepared since 2021 taught us yet again to cope with uncertainties and to keep going in order to provide quality education. I have no doubt that we will face whatever comes our way as a team in 2022 as well. Thank you to all of you for your continued fighting spirit.

1.10 The Gay Beggars

The student theatre group of the Department of English continued to find new ways to keep active online. The year started off with the release of two music videos by the band The Exchangers, who had written original music for the planned 2020 production of *Intimate Exchanges*. As the play itself could not be performed, the cast and band got together to film the music videos as an alternative. The band also released the full album of songs (titled "The Exchangers") in 2021. Continuing on from the online play readings that were started last year, the Beggars hosted three play readings (29.1 Evan Linder & Andrew Hobgood's *5 Lesbians Eating a Quiche*; 25.2 Bee Scott's *Mission Creep*; 25.6 Therese Rebeck's *O Beautiful*).

The biggest project was launched in March 2021: a series of online, live play performances titled "The Gay Beggars go Zoom." The project, which is still running, plans to put on a performance every two months, with each performance led by new team of creative leads. The project is designed as an easy starting point for people interested in joining the Beggars, but unable to commit to a full semester of rehearsals. The first performance was an adaptation written by one of our members, titled *The Merry Wives of Corona*, and had performances in May. The second play was performed in August: Ian McEwan and Carrie McWethy's *Bad Auditions...On Camera*. In September and October, the Beggars organised four stage combat workshops, which taught the basics of sword fighting for stage, as well as how to simulate physical altercations in a safe way. The stage combat workshops will be offered again in the future.

Together with the FG English, an online Bloomsday celebration was put on on June 16th, featuring dramatic readings and live music. The Beggars were present with an info stand at the "Start Smart" week on the first day of classes of the Autumn term, and were also present at the English Seminar welcome meeting for 1st-semester students.


