



Statement of Language Proficiency on Completion of a BA in English at the University of Basel

This statement confirms that on successful completion of a BA in English at Basel University, a graduate is a proficient user of English and has attained the C2 Council of Europe¹ level of competence in English:

- Students can understand with ease virtually everything heard or read.
- Students can summarise information from different spoken and written sources, reconstructing arguments and accounts in a coherent presentation.
- Students can express themselves spontaneously, very fluently and precisely, differentiating finer shades of meaning even in the most complex situations.

The BA English is taught entirely in English, providing an immersive environment in all courses and all interactions with staff. Its curriculum is built on three pillars (75 credit points in total): Anglophone literary and cultural studies (26 cp), English linguistics (26 cp) and academic communication in English (9 cp). This program also entails writing in the form of formative papers, seminar papers (5 cp) and a written exam (5 cp) as well as courses in other philologies (4 cp). The credit points in English entail 61 cp classroom interaction, which total to 1525 hours of work, thus providing students with more than the suggested 1000-1200 hours of guided learning.²

Students of the MA English are expected to fulfill the C2 level at the beginning of their studies as they are required to provide an equivalent of the BA English in Basel to start their studies.
